How is the climate in Kenya different to the climate in the UK?



A season is a part of a year. In the **UK** there are four **seasons**: spring, summer, autumn and winter.

In **Kenya** there are two **seasons**: the wet or rainy season and the dry season. Both seasons are hot.





In the UK, **spring** is from March to May, **summer** is from June to August, **autumn** is from September to November and **winter** is from December to February.

In Kenya, the **wet** seasons are from March to May and November to December. It rains a lot in the **wet** seasons and is very **humid**.





In the UK, July and August are the hottest months. In winter it **snows** and there is lots of **ice**.

In Kenya, the **dry** seasons are from January to February and June to October. It is less humid so it feels cooler than the wet seasons.
