Other Curriculum Learning

Using a piece of card, see if you can draw a scene on the front of your favourite place e.g. a beach, or the funfair. Turn it over and draw rectangle shapes on the back which you can cut out and then you have your own jigsaw puzzle.

Have a go at designing your own meal. Write a set of instructions for how to make one of the dishes. Investigate your favourite animal, for example an owl. What can you find out about it? Can you write a poem about it or complete a piece of art to show it?

See what you can build using lego or other pieces of construction. Can it be something that is taller than you? Wider? Can it have different layers or different special features?

Draw your own self portrait, using a mirror to help capture your best features.

Create a dance film with new steps for your teachers to learn.
