Live Lessons (via Teams)

English: I look forward to you joining us for English at:

9.15am or 9.45am

Today we will be thought tracking the characters.

Follow up activity after lesson:

Click on 22.2.21 English independent task. You need to draw a scene depicting the children hearing the stories without happy endings. There could be shadowy monsters around them or a child in their bed screaming or parents trying to comfort them. You could also include Jub in her hole and the witch with the sack of happy endings and show what they are thinking and feeling. You will need to draw a thought bubble for each character and write in it what the character is thinking and feeling. Remember to include capital letters and punctuation at the end of your sentence/s!

Maths: I look forward to you joining us for maths at:

10.15 or 10.45

Today we are looking at adding decimals within 1.

Follow-up activity after lesson:

Click on 22.2.21 Maths independent task. Have a go at either the bronze, silver or gold questions like you would in class. You don’t have to print them out, just write your answers on a piece of paper. There is also a challenge to try if you want to. After you have had a go at the questions, you or an adult can mark them. Anything you aren’t sure about we can go through tomorrow.

Topic: I look forward to you joining us at: **1.15 or 1.45**

Today we will be learning about what causes tornadoes and the effect they have.

Follow-up activity after lesson:

Click on 22.2.21 Topic independent task. Choose your challenge: bronze/silver or gold.

Optional Practical Activity – Make a tornado in a bottle. See sheet on website for instructions.

Optional Challenges –

- Poetry** - Write a shape poem in the shape of a tornado, using powerful verbs to describe the actions of a tornado.
- News Bulletin** – Create a news bulletin about the aftermath of a tornado - interview eyewitnesses and use maps to show the tornado’s path.

Spellings

Harder way: Set a time limit.





E.g.</p> <p>l la lat late later</p>	<p>Jot down any words you aren't sure about and look them up in a dictionary to check their meaning.</p>	<p>Multi-skills - Basketball Sock Shoot Out You will need: a toy storage box or similar and 5 pairs of rolled up socks.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Place the toy storage box against a wall (ideally outside) and count 5 strides away. Try to throw the socks into the box directly or by rebounding off the wall. Keep practising until you get 5 out of 5 in. Challenge other people in your house! <p>Easier way: Try throwing from only 3 strides away, using an underarm throw. Harder way: Try throwing from different angles into the box.</p>
