Live Lessons (via Teams)

<p>English: I look forward to you joining us for English at: 9.15am or 9.45am</p> <p>Today we will be writing our own versions of the next part of the story using our story maps from yesterday.</p> <p>Follow up activity after lesson:</p> <p>We will be writing a version of the next part of the story together. We will be focussing on using fronted adverbials followed by commas to start sentences and trying to include a relative clause. You will then be able to have a go at writing your own version of the next part of the story. Remember to reread your work as you are writing and at the end. You can edit as you go. If possible, shared your story with someone else either in your house, over the phone or send it to me to read.</p>	<p>Maths: I look forward to you joining us for maths at: 10.15 or 10.45</p> <p>Today we are working on dividing 4d numbers by a 1d number using bus stop method.</p> <p>Follow-up activity after lesson:</p> <p>Click on 3.2.21 Maths independent task. Have a go at either the bronze, silver or gold questions like you would in class. You don't have to print them out, just write your answers on a piece of paper. There is also a challenge to try if you want to. After you have had a go at the questions, you or an adult can mark them. Anything you aren't sure about we can go through tomorrow.</p>	<p>PHSE (Picture News): I look forward to you joining us at: 1.15 or 1.45</p> <p>Today we will be discussing the question: Why do people choose to climb mountains? Before the session, have a think about the question and be prepared to share your thoughts. You may also want to think about: Have you ever climbed a mountain or completed a similar physical challenge? Why did you want to take part? How did you feel before, during and after tackling the challenge?</p> <p>Follow-up activity after lesson:</p> <p>Click on 3.2.21 assembly independent task. Choose one of the activities to complete on the activity sheet.</p>
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Spellings	Reading	Be Active
<p>This week's Spellings are: recommend, relevant, restaurant, rhyme and rhythm.</p> <p>Practise writing your spellings in as many different ways as you can eg: writing, drawing, typing, with sticks, chalk, paint, pens. Why not have a go at one of the activities below?</p> <p>Upper and Lower – Write each of your spelling words twice. First write each word in uppercase letter. Then write each word in lowercase letters. E.g. HUNDRED hundred. Can you alternate between upper and lowercase? E.g. HuNdReD</p>	<p>Read for at least 10 minutes. It could be a chapter of a book, a magazine, a newspaper, a recipe or instruction book, an information book etc. You choose!</p> <p>60 Second Speed Reading Challenge!</p> <p>Choose your challenge – bronze or silver/gold.</p> <p>Set a timer on a phone or use a clock and look at the second hand. Give yourself 60 seconds to read the text.</p> <p>Then give yourself 5 minutes to answer the questions.</p>	<p>Have a go at one of these activities:</p> <p>Play charades using verbs such as run, swim, kick, sprint, tackle, dance, serve, rally, squat, jump, skip, jog, slide. Why not make your own list?</p> <p>10 Minute Shake Up - Try one of the Disney inspired indoor games. Indoor Activities for Kids Kids' Activities Change4Life (www.nhs.uk)</p>



Speed Spell – Choose a spelling and see how many times you can write it in one minute. Repeat 2 more times. Did you improve your score?
