Live Lessons (via Teams)

<b>English:</b> I look forward to you joining us for English at: <b>9.15am or 9.45am</b> Today we will be exploring the first illustration from the book. <b>Follow up activity after lesson:</b> Click on 7.1.21 English independent task 1. Record your ideas and reflections on to the sheet if you print it or write the number for each question on a piece of paper and record your ideas for that question next to it. Then for task 2: write a prediction for what you think is going to happen in the story based on the first picture. Remember to use what you learnt about predictions last term!	<b>Maths:</b> I look forward to you joining us for maths at: <b>10.15 or 10.45</b> Today we are working on comparing and ordering numbers with 6 digits. <b>Follow-up activity after lesson:</b> Click on 7.1.21 Maths independent task. Have a go at the bronze, silver or gold questions like you would in class. You don't have to print them out, just write your answers on a piece of paper. There is also a challenge to try if you want to.	<b>Topic:</b> I look forward to you joining us at: <b>1.15 or 1.45</b> Today we will be starting our new topic Amazing Asia! <b>Follow-up activity after lesson:</b> Click on 7.1.21 Topic independent task. Choose your challenge: bronze, silver or gold. Complete the information about Asia. Use the 7.1.21 – Asia Fact Cards or research with books or the internet if you can. If you can't print the work, then write the numbers for the question/sentence on paper and add your answer next to it.
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Spellings	Reading	Be Active
<p>This week's Spellings are: <b>lightning, marvellous, mischievous, muscle and necessary.</b></p> <p>Practise writing your spellings in as many different ways as you can eg: writing, drawing, typing, with sticks, chalk, paint, pens. Why not have a go at one of the activities below?</p> <p><b>Connect the Dots</b> – Write your spelling words using dots. Connect the dots you've drawn by tracing over them with a coloured pencil.</p> <p><b>Spelling Wordsearch</b> – Use squared paper if you have it. If not, draw your own squares. You need a 10 x 10 grid. Write your spellings in your grid – they can be in any direction. Fill in all the empty squares with letters. Make sure</p>	<p><b>Read for at least 10 minutes. It could be a chapter of a book, a magazine, a newspaper, a recipe or instruction book, an information book etc. You choose!</b></p> <p>How many of the Reading Bingo (attached below) challenges can you complete this week?</p>	<p><b>Have a go at one of these activities:</b></p> <p>Go for a <b>daily walk/bike ride/jog/run.</b></p> <p>Can you beat your time from the day before?</p> <p><b>Play “Fitness Deck”</b> take it turns to pick the top card off the deck and complete a task based on if its Hearts, Clubs, Spades or Diamonds. E.g. Jumping jacks for Hearts, sit-ups for Spades, push-ups for Diamonds and squats for Clubs. The number on the card represents how many times you complete the move. Before starting, decide the value of Aces, Jacks, Queens and Kings.</p>

### Other Curriculum Learning

**After your Topic lesson, you could have a go at one of these activities:**

**Science** – Make a paper helicopter or parachute to investigate the effects of air resistance and gravity. Time how long it takes to fall to the ground. Can you make a new helicopter/parachute that falls more slowly? Think about the forces of gravity and air resistance, and how you can make it fall slower. Draw a picture of your new helicopter/parachute and explain how you made it fall slower. If you are stuck or want more instructions, go to the website for resources.

**Music** - [Exploring 4 beats in a bar \(thenational.academy\)](#) – Have a go at the second understanding pulse and rhythm lesson. Join in with the 25-minute session exploring 4 beats in a bar, the strong beat in the pulse and learn a new piece of music called ‘Crazy Glue’. You will need either some headphones or somewhere that is quiet, a pencil and pen if you want to make notes and your hands!
