
Can I identify features of non-fiction books? Friday 26th February

A mammal is a **vertebrate**, which means it has a backbone. It has hard bones inside its body which make up an **endoskeleton**.




Hang about!

Nonfiction Text Features Answers

Text Feature	Description
Photograph	A real life picture of the item being explained.
Glossary	This section includes words that are listed in alphabetical order with a definition.
Caption	Words that briefly explain a photograph or illustration.
Illustration	A drawing of the item being explained.
Subheading	Tells the reader what information they will find in the following paragraphs before the next subheading.
Table of Contents	A list of headings within the book, and the page number where you can find that heading.
Bold Word	Often a word that is important to the subject of the text or a difficult word that the reader may not know.
Heading	Included at the top of the text, to tell the reader what the entire text is about.
Label	A word that points to a specific part of a photograph or illustration, and tells you the name of that part.
Index	An alphabetical list of key topics, usually in the back of a book, with page numbers of where to find them.
