Music and Well Being: Make it Monday!– Get creative and get your week off to a fantastic start! Make a **Rain Stick**. Create you create the sounds of the rain in the rainforest.

You will need: a long cardboard tube, tape, tin foil, rice, colours

- 1) Tape one end of the tube, leaving no gaps in the tape.
- 2) Fold the tin foil length ways and fold and scrunch into a long sausage
- 3) Push the tin foil inside the tube. Pour the rice into the tube.
- 4) Tape the other end of the tube. When you tip the tube upside down, the rice should trickle through the tin foil loops to create a rain sound.
- 5) Decorate it with paint, coloured paper or felt tips?
