








What's in your pencil case?

'la' and 'le' both mean 'the'.

'la' is feminine and 'le' is masculine.

If you want to say 'a' instead of 'the': **le** becomes **un** and **la** becomes **une**.

la trousse (la troos)		the pencil case
le crayon		the pencil
le stylo (le stee-low)		the pen
le crayon de couleur (le crayon de coo-lur)		the coloured pencil
le taille-crayon (le tay-crayon)		the sharpener
la gomme (la gom)		the rubber
la règle (la ray-gluh)		the ruler

*J'ai un crayon **dans** ma trousse – I have a pencil **in** my pencil case.*

*J'ai une règle **et** un taille-crayon **dans** ma trousse – I have a ruler **and** a sharpener **in** my pencil case.*
