Y2 – Jemison Class Teacher: Mrs Codling

Mae C Jemison is a doctor and a scientist, who became the first black African American woman to go into space. As a child she had always dreamt about being an astronaut but was discouraged by her teachers - because she was a girl. Thankfully, her mother thought otherwise and encouraged her to follow her dreams and to aim high – literally.

Mae's mother told her 'If you believe it and work hard for it, anything is possible' and in 1992 Mae realised her dreams and went into space.

That saying is on the wall in our KS1 corridor and is often referred to, because that is what we aim to instil in all our children.
